Our Program: Nilda Valmores, Executive Director of *My Sister's House* addressed the Club, bringing a local face and voice to the fight against sexual assault, human trafficking and domestic violence. *My Sister's House* seeks to eliminate domestic violence in the Asian and Pacific Islander community through family education, and by increasing the self-determination of Asian and Pacific Islander women. While their focus is on that community, their services are open to all.

They offer a "New Beginnings" women's learning and support group, a 6-bed anti human trafficking shelter and 6 bed transitional house for women and children. In addition, they have programs such as Women at Work Program for domestic violence, human trafficking, and sexual assault survivors of all backgrounds. Their staff perform community outreach and education on domestic violence, human trafficking, and sexual

assault and they staff a 24-hour multilingual crisis line, which all are in need of ongoing funding assistance.


