Tom Jones, Executive Director of the Aerospace Museum of California

This meeting's speaker was Tom Jones, The Executive Director of the Aerospace Museum of California. With over forty aircraft and an intriguing aerospace section, the museum explores the wonders of flight and technology. With many hands-on learning exhibits, Visitors to the museum get to get up close and even touch the wonders of flight. The outdoor portion of the museum includes F-80 Shooting Star, F-100D Super Sabre, F-102 Delta Dagger, F-104B Star Fighter, F-4C Phantom, and A-10 Thunderbolt.

The Engine exhibits include examples from the earliest piston engines, up to the big rocket engines. They have knowledgeable Docents to teach the history behind the engines that power the aircraft.

The Museum is available for group tours and events

There is now a café in the Museum named The Old Crow Café whose décor is inspired by WW2 triple Ace Colonel Clarence "Bud" Anderson. With Sandwiches, pizza, salads, and more.

The Aerospace Museum of California is a Smithsonian Affiliate.

Hours of operation are Thursday through Sunday 9am to 4pm (closed on major holidays)

OPENING REMARKS: "This Week in History August 7th - 13th"

1957 – Buddy Holly and the Crickets immortal "That'll Be The Day" Charted reaching #1.
1958 – Elvis Presley performed at the Florida Theater in Jacksonville. A local judge hauled Presley into the judges chambers after his first show and ordered him to done down the act. Elvis told reporters "I can't figure out what I'm doing wrong, I know my mother approves of what I am doing"
1960 – Pete Best auditioned for John Lennon, Paul McCartney, and George Harrison for their first ever performances in Hamburg Germany. The group had now decided to call themselves The Beatles, and Best became their new regular drummer
1963 – Ready, Steady, Go which was the UK version of American Bandstand premiered on BBC TV
1966 – Roy Orbison began work on the soundtrack and film The Fastest Gun Alive which was his only film. This role was originally intended for Elvis Presley
1969 – The world-famous Abbey Road album cover was shot today outside the namesake studio and street. A police officer held up traffic while The Beatles Photographer, Ian Macmillan stood atop a step ladder and marched the Mop Tops across the zebra like street corner in order to get the historic picture
1970 – Janice Joplin gave her last performance at Harvard Stadium
And the number one song August 13, 1966 was Summer in the City by the lovin spoonful



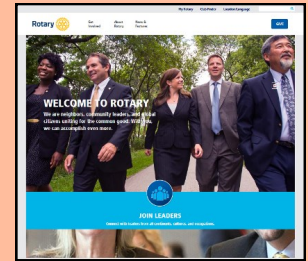
