National Coloring Book Day went off without a hitch. The highlight of the meeting was clearly the Foundation Drawing, which was won by Past President Tom Wallace. Tom gave an emotional head-nod in accepting this Major Award. Needless to say, not a dry eye in the house...

Past President and Assistant Governor Emeritus Drew Gidlof introduced our first Vocational speaker of the year; none other than our own President Peter Anderson. (Spin alert: My sources tell me that this had been carefully planned for months and was not a reaction to the lack of a confirmed speaker.)

Peter let us in on how transportation finances work at the State level through his job as the Senior Transportation Engineer for Caltrans. He manages the 1.2 billion in federal funds as well as the additional funds from the state through the SB1 money (gas tax). Peter helps determine how those funds get distributed to local agencies for safety programs, bridge rehabilitation and road maintenance and he clears the way for local agencies to maximize their money with the least amount of paperwork. Projects are always selected by local agencies including cities and counties, not Caltrans, with federal dollars accounting for up to 90% of the necessary funding. Peter has been involved in the funding aspects of numerous projects locally and across the state. Some of those projects include the I-5 Rehab Program that will be starting soon through Sacramento, the Safety Barrier Project north of Clarksburg, installing rumble strips on high-risk roads in our region and the Pedestrian Overpass Bridge on Highway 50.

As is always the case, some of our best speakers come from within our Mighty Club and President Anderson was no exception.


