Marty has proven to be the most selfless and helpful individual. For starters, he has become quite the active Rotarian in the club: working the fireworks booth and the beer booth at the Yolo County Fair, planting trees, delivering each month for Meals on Wheels, attending regularly, and he also volunteers at Loaves and Fishes in Sacramento.

Here's a Marty anecdote from Carol Bogart, Marty's partner for Meals on Wheels:

"I'm just back from doing Meals On Wheels with Marty Garozzo. One of our stops was a couple (the man is blind, the woman appears to have limited mobility).

"They'd been expecting their weekly bag of food (in addition to their daily hot lunch), which we were bringing to them 'three days late,' Marty was told. I mixed up which Dolores on our list (there are two) was the right one, and gave the bag to the wrong Dolores. As we were driving, we realized the mistake, finished delivering all the hot meals (as it happens, the correct Dolores and her husband are our last delivery), and I explained what had happened.

"Both of them just seemed to accept without complaint that it would be another day without complaint -- but there was something in the woman's eyes that made me ask, 'Is it all the food you have?' She nodded and said, 'Someone stole my (welfare) check,' and started to cry.

"Well naturally, Marty and I immediately went back to the senior center to get another one, only to learn they wouldn't have any more until Friday. Marty asked, 'What was in it?' They said they always try to include a meat item, a starch and a fruit: in this case Spam, bananas (3) and a box of powdered sweet potatoes you add water to. I said to Marty, 'Take me to my house. I have things on my shelf and in the freezer I can give them.'

"Marty said, 'No, the store's right around the corner. Let's shop and get them what they were supposed to get.' And we did -- improvising a little with fresh sweet potatoes and a box dinner of chicken fettuccini, plus the bananas and can of Spam. Marty paid the bill and joked that I could buy him a cup of coffee.

"When we took them the bag of food, the lady thanked us and cried again. The blind husband, who was standing in the door when we arrived, said 'God bless you,' then put out his hand and we both shook it."




