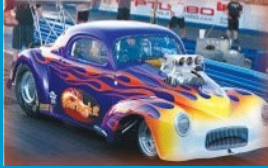

**SPEAKER PROGRAM**

**Program: Mike Summers—Crisis Intervention Team  
Training**



1,100 hours is the average training time that a police officer receives before he or she ever steps onto the street. Of that training, only four hours is typically spent on dealing with people with mental health issues. Mike Summers, retired police officer, spent a career learning how to engage the mentally ill and homeless in Midtown Sacramento.

Mike has taken his experiences into retirement to assist law enforcement and first responders to better deal with the mentally ill. Mike has developed Crisis Intervention Training with the goal of fostering interaction between law enforcement and mental health services. The training teaches officers to recognize the signs and symptoms of mental illness; improve safety to officers and patients; and to solve a problem, not necessarily make an arrest. The training works on making an officer more adept at dealing with the mentally ill and improves the officer's communication skills. Officers learn to identify whether the behavior is criminal or not and determine if a person should go to jail. Currently police officers across the state are being trained, but there is still a political battle to make the funding readily available.

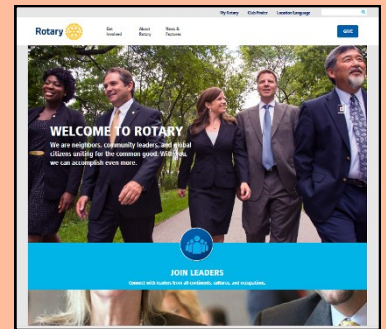

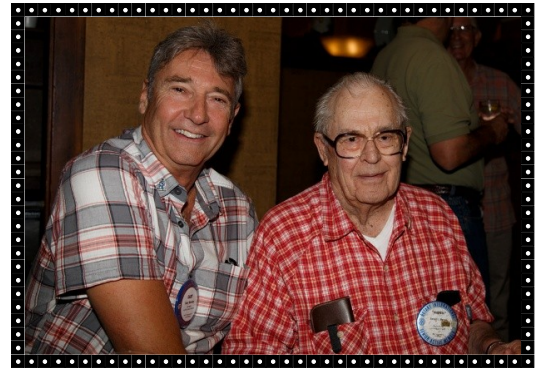
