As a brand-new empty nester, Robin decided she needed a hobby and, having never played the game of basketball, decided THAT

would be the perfect sport to officiate. Robin's belief that, "you can do anything you want if you have the desire and the technical competence" drove her to attend Ref Camp in Chico, CA and become a Certified Basketball Referee. Armed with her best friend, the all-powerful Technical Foul, Robin began reffing games played by kids as young as 1st graders, to as big as high-school boys. One of Robin's goals was to always beat the players



to the baseline, no matter how big and fast they were, so that they would never think that she couldn't, and she earned their respect. By reffing these games and working so closely with these kids, she was able to teach them valuable life lessons through mentorship and, when presented with an opportunity, by dropping priceless nuggets

of advice regarding sportsmanship, humility,

positive attitudes and respect. Robin sometimes wished she could drop a few large nuggets on some of the parents and coaches that, many times, were her biggest challenge. All of the money Robin earned from Reffing went into her own non-profit, Playing for Keeps, to help underprivileged kids that need support for fees, sporting equipment and even musical instruments.






