The Club wishes to thank Colonel Adam Marshall for his very informative and interesting presentation on the going's on and rivalry with China.

China has been working with 100 year plans instead of the shorter plans of the United States. Their quest for world domination has been ongoing. As they emerge into a world economic power their growth has been continuing. Their sphere of political and military influence are growing towards the East across the pacific.

Over the years China's military spending had varied from 1.8-2.5% of their GDP. As their economy has experienced exponential expansion due in part to labor camps, government subsidy of labor and overall cheaper labor. This has resulted in their spending of about US\$20Billion to now US\$130Billion. Their military force has grown to well over the United States in both personnel and equipment including much more higher technology modern equipment.

The one thing that can slow down China's rapid growth for domination is their population demographics. Their "one child per family policy" which was used to prevent to large of population growth has left age gaps which will result in an aging population without enough young people to support the older generation and be committed to any wars.

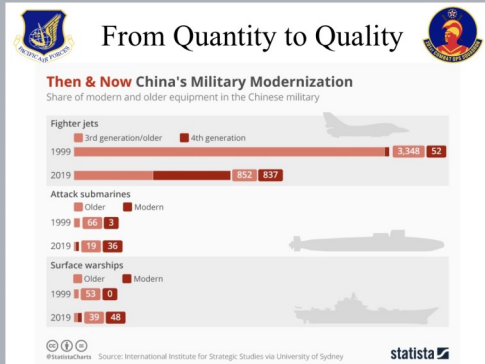
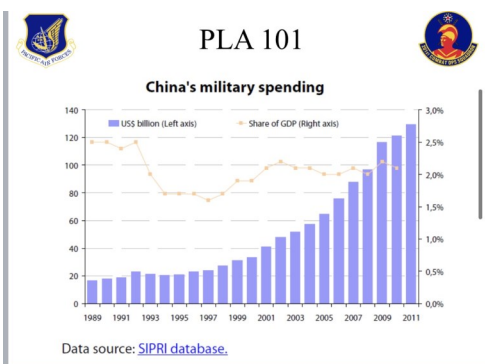
Brian Russ
