Tim's background is too extensive to write about here. But we did learn that he has been flying airplanes since he was 15, is an accomplished swimmer and snow skier, and a working proficiency in Spanish.

Tim is already involved in our international water project, and this reporter has personally delivered Meals on Wheels with him. Whew! That's all really cool. But what would you expect from someone named 'Tim'.
