Talk of Tubbs and Kincade wildfires 2017 and 2019

36,000+ Acres vs 77k 5600 structures vs 374 Emergency (last minute vs 190,000 Healdsburg.. 22 deaths vs 0 deaths.

Changed life; gave hope and purpose.

Reactive; vs early notification

Message: what's on fire and what's not on fire? We call it a wildfire. But what burned are the structures with links to things around the house.


What can you do? Home hardening: Homie out approach. Start at the house. Vegetation management. Evacuation has a plan.

Fire resiliency: vents gutters windows fence / decks. Single pane vs dual pane.

Decks of wood; how those connect to your house.

Vegetation management. Zone zero close to the house. Call that the ember resistant zone. First 5 feet be gravel rock soil hardscape first 5 feet. Zone 1 5 to 30 feet. Lean and clean green zone. Spaces in between. Islands of the right type of vegetation. Zone 2 30 to 100+. Tree canopies up a bit and healthy. Reduce ladder fuels. Low growing grass might be connected to higher bush connected to a low branch. Reach canopy fires! Hard to fight up there.

Know your zone. Know routes and alt rouets. Stay on pavement best. Head towards 101. North or South.



If you feel unsafe before an order. Just go.

Lost cell phone: designated place to meet?

County has chipping program: available to Healdsburgers.

Open space ridge introduction of sheep tomorrow and goats will follow. (on ridge) Bringing them back. Veg management pan.

CPP: our community Wildfire prevention plan. Grant funds. Future. Like Cal

Average \$1.60/sf for sprinklers!

Typically stay in your home after an activation. 90% are 1 or 2 sprinkler heads

Working on CPP: procure funds

Weed abatement program predecessor. Will continue. But will be doing wildfire assessments in every parcel in Healdsburg: bringing

Norm Fujita: recent mitigation preserve work had to be cancelled. Update? Lance broom pulling and burns; more to come on top of Fitch Mtn. Look for commitment to continue; looking to get more resources and time. Also wants to say: this is one of the reasons he is in this outreach; getting community partnership can amplify the current resources available within the HFD.

Doug Garrett: Can work commitment from **McGuire** et al: can that help with fire fighter access? Lance: the fitch mtn side access is well / easily available.
