TODAY'S PROGRAM: Club Assembly

President Doug started the assembly by showing slides of where most of our money goes. The largest amount of money we raise is given to education (scholarships, etc.), with donations to community causes next. We then donate money to hunger and to international programs. He said we raised \$48,920 for the Scholarship Foundation at the Crab Feast (Fund a Need) and \$84,660 for the Community Fund.



The Crab Feast grossed \$195,011 and netted \$133,580. The consensus is that this Crab Feast was our best by far.

Youth Services - Kellie Larson

Kellie stated that we are committed to sponsoring two RYLA students this year.

She thanked **Jim Manly** and **Don Mitchell** for their Interact involvement. They work closely with the Sunrise Club.

The Scholarship program is thriving.

Our club will once again be involved in Healdsburg High's Senior Seminar on May 23, 2023. Plans are being made now.

Kellie stated that there are more programs we're trying to "get going" again, such as mentoring high school students and the Rotary Exchange Program, which **Dick Cochran** is working on. Hopefully, we can start it next year.





• Environment - Norm Fujita



Norm went over the different projects and agencies the Environmental Committee deals with.

We have helped purchase, through a district grant, battery operated tools for the Russian River Keepers and some members have participated in their clean-up days.

We continue to work on the District Environment Challenge and have completed eight of the challenges so far.

• International Service - Cathy King

Cathy will be discussing in more detail what has been happening with International Service.

Today she briefly went over some of the projects we've been working on.

We have new "My Dream" calendars made by Ukrainian children to help raise money for the Rotary Clubs in the



Ukraine to use to purchase needed items such as emergency medical kits and generators. A Zoom meeting was recently held with the two clubs we've been aiding and they have been thankful for all we've done for them so far. They listed the ways they have used the donated money to help those in the country. Cathy has recorded the Zoom call, so if you'd like to see it, please let her know.

A group from our club will be traveling to Merida, Mexico this month to help the Rotary Merida English Club and the Merida Rotary work with villagers to build a community garden. The clubs will also be helping teach the village how to grow and sell their vegetables so they can become more self-sustaining. We were awarded a District Grant to begin this project.

We continue to be involved with Amigos de Guatemala Education Program. More information will be coming at another meeting.

Rotary Foundation - Dick Cochran



The Rotary Foundation's goal is to maintain the club's giving to "End Polio Now" and to publicize World Polio Day.

One of the programs where **Dick** would like to see more progress is the Benefactor Program where members can leave money to Rotary through their will or trust. Only two members in our club have done this.

Over the last years our club has contributed \$71,231.32 to Polio Plus, largely because of our Green Hair Day campaign. **Dick** stated that he has high hopes for this year's Green Hair Day on March 17th and that plans are in the making for it now.

Dick encouraged people to make holiday/birthday donations as gifts to family and friends.

So far this year we have donated \$4,103 to Rotary International and \$1,594 to Polio Plus (but just wait until March 17th!!!)

Alex said that the Dinners for 8 were so successful that the committee is planning on lining up more for the spring and summer.
