✚ **Fred Roberts-Riddell Project Update:** Where to meet: **8:30am on Thursday, October 28<sup>th</sup>** at the Healdsburg City Corporation Yard (550 Westside Road, Healdsburg). You will caravan to the site (with carpools as comfort and/or logistics allow). We will work until **12:30pm**, then take lunch. People are free to leave as soon as the workday is over! What to expect: Ideally, we will have everyone with vehicles that have AWD, 4WD, or the capability of handling a bit more rugged terrain, head directly to the Cabin, but if any are unable to get directly up in vehicles, we may have to set up a local caravan, with one or two of the more suitable vehicles, to bring people up the hill from the lower “Red Barn”

We will allow everyone a chance to use the equipment (outside of chainsaws), but when not in the slot for “equipment operator”, people can plan on doing manual labor such as: swamping [moving organic material] for the equipment operator, hand sawing limbs, and lopping, or hand sawing, large broom or aggressive Douglas Fir individuals. What to bring: Comfortable clothing for wet and cold weather, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as Hard Hats, Eye Pro (Safety glasses), and Ear Pro (ear plugs or earmuffs), Masks, your own gloves and tools if you have them, lunch/snacks, sturdy shoes for hiking, long pants for poison oak, full water bottle/s, sunscreen, layers you can remove as it warms up, and a backpack to hold it all. What will be available: Extra gloves, extra water, extra PPE, hand sanitizer, sunscreen, extra masks, and tools. Helpful tools: Loppers, handsaws, and hand pruners.

### **Kellie Larson introduced Paul Dolan:**
