TODAY'S PROGRAM:

Dr. Bernard Harris, Astronaut, Physician and STEM Advocate

Fred Roberts introduced Dr. Harris, who grew up in Texas near Waco (which Fred pointed out is where Baylor University, his alma mater, is located). Dr. Harris became interested in becoming an astronaut from a very young age, when he saw the television images of the first moon walk in 1969. After completing medical school and his residency at the Mayo Clinic, Dr. Harris pursued his dream and



eventually became the first African American astronaut to complete a spacewalk. He served on multiple missions, including a joint mission to the first international space station with Russian astronauts. Dr. Harris served as flight surgeon and applied his medical training to helping NASA better understand the effects of weightlessness on the human body, particularly bones and blood. Dr. Harris shared a number of images and short videos of his space adventures and answered many questions about space travel and his experiences.

Since retiring from NASA, Dr. Harris has also established his own foundation and heads the National Math & Science Initiative, which has developed programs to promote STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) education in high schools and colleges around the country.
