TODAY'S PROGRAM:

Ariel Kelly, Vice-Mayor and Councilperson for City of Healdsburg.



Ms. Kelly gave the Club a fastpaced yet thorough overview of many of the major planning initiatives the city council and city government are undertaking. She covered the city's efforts to ensure compliance with and evolution of the Healdsburg housing plan, including the major low-income and affordable housing projects. She updated us on major infrastructure projects, including water, streets, parks and community

centers. There will be a November ballot initiative that could, if approved, allow the city to issue infrastructure bonds and complete projects like the Saggio Hills Park and update of Badger Park much sooner than using current budgeting. Anti-poverty initiatives like the basic income trial and the efforts to reach and reduce our community's unhoused population were also topics for discussion. Like other areas of Sonoma County, Healdsburg is also evaluating a cannabis policy, including the possible permitting of up to two retail dispensaries outside of the core downtown area.
