The economy.

- Will there be a recession-the big question. It's possible but if so Europe will be in worse shape
- We have gotten 97% of the pre Covid jobs back
- California had more venture capital invested in the last two years than all the other states together
- Challenges: work force and

housing for the work force. Moderate income housing is especially short

- Our debt to income (?) ratio is the lowest in 30 years
- Credit card spending is strong and this year's consumer spending is the strongest in 10 years
- We are in the 13th year of budget surplus
- the focus of the surplus is to pay down debt, especially the retirement funds and to make sure we have a healthy rainy-day fund

Education

 After years of being near the bottom in public school spending, in the next two years we will be in the top 10

Price of gas.

• A gas tax rebate will be going out in the next 3-4 months, graduated amounts depending on income. And there will be a diesel tax holiday from 9/22 to 9/23

Covid relief spending.

12 billion has been spent on Covid relief and spending will continue for the next 12 months

Public Schools.

- 7.4 billion will be given out as block grants. It will be a flat rate based on the number of students in the district and school districts will have 4 years to spend it.
- There will also be special funding for school bus drivers. This is a critical shortage in rural areas.
- There will also be a new program to encourage people to become school mental health counsellors. There is a critical need in that area also and the program will repay student loan debt for graduates in mental health counseling who work for a specified number of years in a school.
- Humboldt State has now become a Polytechnic University. This should take some pressure off San Luis Obispo and help kids from the poorer rural areas of Northern Calif get into high paying fields. The poorest populations in the state are not in the big cities but in the rural parts of Northern California and parts of the Central Valley

PG&E.

- The problem is with the CEO and management who have prioritized share holder profit over anything else. A bill is headed for the Governor's signature with funding to put the most critical miles of power lines underground, PG&E needs to use the federal money available first and auditors are needed to make sure that money is spent correctly.
- We will be short on power this summer due to the heat and the drought. The state is working on a plan that will take 5 years to implement and will focus on 4 types of renewable energy: offshore wind, on shore wind, commercial solar and geothermal. However, until these are implemented, we will need to keep relying on the existing natural gas and possibly the existing nuclear.

Overturn of Row v Wade.

Prop 1 on the ballot will mandate that in California women have a right to contraception, reproductive health care and abortion. The State plans to expand Medical so that all women needing care will be able to access it and California will change the reporting so those accessing care in California will have their identity protected. It is expected that 1.3 million women will come to California for care.

Wildfires

That State has been putting resources into firefighting. There are now new helicopters that can fly day and night, and carry 1500 gal of water, or 10 firefighters. The closest to us is at Cobb Mtn and can be here in 15 minutes. There is also planned a helicopter pad at the Geysers that could operate around the clock.

The Redwood Trail is getting funding. It will bring tourism to parts of Northern California that need the income. Smart is committed to paved trail for pedestrians and bikes along their rail right of way which will cover the Marin and Sonoma parts of the trail. Mendocino and Humboldt will make use of the actual rail tracks to create the trail

Affordable housing

State is working on accelerating the building of *affordable housing* by expediting the permit process if enough percentage of the project is affordable

Homelessness. Legislature is looking into establishing some sort of conservatorship for individuals need care and won't willingly seek it.
