TODAY'S PROGRAM: Project Amigo

Dora Zuniga is the Guidance Director of Project Amigo. She comes with great credentials, having been involved in several non-profits over the years. She is a member of the Tampa Rotary. She said she once had a mentor who said real adults learn to play golf and join a service club. She joined Rotary and learned to play golf. She still belongs to Rotary, but gave up playing golf a while ago.



The Project Amigo program is 40 years old and was founded by a gentleman who was traveling to Mexico and saw children who were not in school on a school day. He learned that education in Mexico is only free through sixth grade and then families have to pay tuition for their children to attend middle school and high school. Obviously, many families cannot afford the cost of education. Project Amigo was created to help fund the education for those who can't afford it, by awarding scholarships. Project Amigo is located in Colima, Mexico, about 2 and a half hours from Guadalajara. Rotary has played an integral part in making the project successful. The Novato club was involved in the building of the school. Other service clubs have helped by donating money and labor to the project.

Ms. Zuniga shared several success stories of students who have gone through the program. They were sponsored over the years by individuals. In order to be awarded a scholarship, the students must maintain a certain GPA, apply yearly, have the approval and support of their families, and do community service. She stated that Rotary values are built into each day. They partner with Rotarians, the Becarios, and other like-minded charitable people. The project promotes literacy in all their activities and gives away books to students since there are no libraries and few books to be had. They depend on volunteers who come to Colima to help with various projects.

Project Amigo has been successful over the years and has graduated over 900 high school seniors. They have a 94% graduation rate. Our club sponsored students from 2001-2017 and they are hoping we would be willing to become involved again.
