#### **TODAY'S PROGRAM**



Area Governor Sandy Krutz introduced District Governor Jennifer Strong.

Jennifer lives in a property, located in Lakeport, California, that has been in her family for 6 generations. She was always interested in helping people. During Jr. High School, she was chosen to be the first Rotary student

representative at the Lakeport Rotary Club. She was the founding member of the Lake Area Rotary Fire Relief Fund which succeeded in raising over one million dollars in 2015 for the residents in Lake County affected by the fire. The Relief Fund was born from Jennifer's original idea to raise \$50,000 to help impacted communities!! Jennifer also enjoys flying her airplane.

#### **District Governor Jennifer Strong: Rotary Stories**

Jennifer's presentation was unique and inspiring. It was not the traditional power point presentation but rather sharing stories how powerful Rotary members can be to the communities. She started by sharing how in 2017, the idea to expand the District Fire Relief Fund to cover the areas of Sonoma, Napa, and Mendocino counties was born at a Rotary meeting held at Tayman, where Jennifer made a presentation about the Fire Relief Fund. To date, the Fund has raised over \$3 Million dollars.



Jennifer is a financial planner by trade. She underlined that TIME is a commodity that once it is spent, you can't get it back. She made us reflect why we joined Rotary and why do we continue to spend our TIME in Rotary. Jennifer has a different view on Rotary's international moto of "Service Above Self". She prefers "Service Feeds Self". She explained that without something we are getting from the TIME we give to Rotary, we would question the time spent.

**Jean Herschede** volunteered to share WHY she joined Rotary and the impact she has made. **Jean's** love of Latin America coupled with Rotary's International Services committee, led her to manage Amigos de Guatemala. From a small idea, **Jean** and her teams have been able to put over 120 students through school, build a library and put the school's first internet.



We heard how both **Jean** and Jennifer's passions and efforts not only had a positive impact on people, but it impacted them as well. The power of being in Rotary is not only the change that can happen as a result of member's efforts, but also the impact it could have on each member.
