Laurie Jacobson: Top of the Mountain: The Beatles at Shea Stadium



Laurie Jacobson is an awardwinning author and television producer. She started her career performing comedy improv with classmates Robin Williams, John Ritter and John Larroquette.

The stories she uncovered while there became the basis for her first book, Hollywood Heartbreak.

Since then, she has written and produced many documentaries, television series and specials. She wrote 5 more books. Her fourth, titled "Timmy's in the Well – The Jon Provost Story", is a memoir she co-wrote with her husband who starred as Timmy in the iconic TV series "Lassie." Her newest book, "Top of the Mountain: The Beatles at Shea Stadium" captures the compelling story behind the biggest entertainment event the world had ever seen.

Laurie gave a very informative and entertaining account of her career in the entertainment industry. She has written 6 books, several of which were available for purchase at a discount at our meeting. She is married to Jon Provost who starred in Lassie. Surprisingly, Lassie is still on in 60 countries.

Her book, "Top of the Mountain..." gives the details of what it took to bring the Beatles to Shea Stadium. It was Sid Bernstein and not Ed Sullivan who introduced them to America. The tickets were a great deal - \$4, \$5 and \$6. Many of today's stars were there as teenagers. Through her contacts Laurie got hundreds of never-before-seen photos for her book. The Beatles always had a girl act open for them to appease the boys in the audience. People came to SEE and not Hear the Beatles. Because of the screaming it was nearly impossible to hear them play.
