

Announcement from **Andy Elkind** on the SRJC Foundation **Kevin Burke** Scholarship:

It is appropriate that our speaker today is Mary-Frances Walsh, from the National Alliance for Mental Illness in Sonoma County. Almost a year has passed since the loss of Chief **Kevin Burke**. Sadly, he

took his own life last April. **Kevin** was a club member and a supporter of all that we do. In the intervening time, concerned members of the community have been getting together to figure out how best to honor his life and legacy. These community members include our former mayor Ozzy Jimenez, current Council Member Evelyn Mitchell, City Manager Jeff Kay and Police Chief Matt Jenkins among others. The group has determined the best way to honor **Kevin** is with a scholarship fund to support people looking toward careers in law enforcement specifically through SRJC programs. Formal announcements will come.

→ Our Rotary club's support has been formalized beginning with today's club board meeting where the board authorized a donation of \$5,000. Additionally, an anonymous club member has agreed to match up to \$4,000 of all checks collected today. Donors make checks payable to the SRJC Foundation and include "**Kevin Burke** Scholarship" in the memo.

# TODAY'S PROGRAM: Mary-Frances Walsh, National Alliance on Mental Illness

Mary-Frances Walsh confirmed (at presentation end) that her slides can be distributed to club members.

NAMI has 600+ US Affiliates; Mary-Frances leads the Santa Rosa office. Includes a mental health library on site and promotes Education, Awareness, Support, and a Warmline.



- The Warmline receives about 65 calls per month.
- Who does NAMI serve? Someone who supports someone.
- What is QPR? Question, Persuade, Refer

The City of Santa Rosa exclusively has a Mobile Support Team (Office of Public Conservator). NAMI and allies encourage Sonoma County Supervisors to amplify/extend the Healdsburg and SR City Mobile Support Team model and get licensed mental health professional presence at the first response.

#### \*\*Suicide Risk Factors\*\*

- Mental health condition
- Access to lethal means
- Prolonged stress
- Experiencing harassment or bullying
- Life events: rejection, divorce, financial crisis, loss
- Sensational accounts of suicide

## \*\*Suicide Protective Factors\*\*

- Access to mental health care
- Being proactive about mental health
- Feeling connected
- Limited access to lethal means
- Beliefs that encourage help-seeking, sense of purpose, self-esteem, religion

In a crisis, or if you are worried about someone use the new 3 digit phone number, 988 or visit 988lifeline.org. Created this past July, it's a mental health crisis, substance crisis nationwide hotline to a crisis counselor.

#### What can communities do?

- Identify and support people at risk
- Learn and teach coping and problem solving skills
- Promote safe storage for firearms and medications
- Offer activities that promote feeling connected and not alone
- Connect people at risk to effective coordinated care
- Support survivors

What can you do when someone is in crisis?

- Call 988
- Ask them directly

- Listen without judging
- Stay with the person
- Remove any objects that could be used in a suicide attempt
- Stay connected

Club members thanked Mary-Frances Walsh, asked and received an overview of NAMI funding sources, commented on an Australian app promoting awareness and prevention, commented on the timely contributions by **Kevin Burke** to Healdsburg police's effectiveness. And the sentiment that remembering these are the ways to help to move forward.

Mary-Frances in closing "The value of lived experience is tremendous."
