*Most of us wince when we take our car in for mechanical work knowing we'll unload at least \$500 or more. Here's a note from yesteryear on fixing up the old Model T. "Many Model T's can be driven two, three and five years and even longer. You'll be surprised how little it costs to put it in tip top shape. New fenders, for instance, cost from \$3.50 to \$5.00 each. Labor charge is \$1.00 to \$2.50. Tuning ulp the motor costs \$1.00. Brake shoes can be installed and emergency brakes equalized for a labor charge for \$1.25. A labor charge of \$4.00 o \$5.00 wille cover the overhaul of the front axle, re-bushing springs and alighning and adjusting wheels. Labor charge for overhauling the average rear axle run from \$5.75 to \$7.00. Grinding valves and cleaning carbon can be done for \$3.00. A set of four new pistons and rings costs only \$7.00. Motor and transmission completely overhaul costs \$20.00."
