<u>Did You Know?</u> The Owatonna Foundation has been a generous supporter of our Public Library...one of the best in southern Minnesota. Grants donated to the library over the years include:

In 1976, \$1,000 given to the OPL for bicentennial micro-filming project; In 1980, \$375 was given for a realist Swinger Reader; In 1986, \$1500 was given for a micro-film reader; In 1990, \$8,178 was granted for a micro-film sealer and printer; In 1991, \$200,000 was given for the remodeling, construction and a new addition to the library; In 1998, \$17,699 was given for a micro-film digital reader/printer system; In 2010, \$6,131 was given for the painting repair of the White Horse which was donated by Reuben Kaplan. The painting is located above the fireplace on second floor.
