There was an interesting letter in the May ROTARY magazine from Alan Anderson of the Northfield ROTARY Club. (Alan is the son of Sophie Anderson and the late Dr. Frank Anderson of Owatonna). His letter to the editor was entitled "Cause for Concern". He writes, "We have read of the incredible and growing losses from hurricanes: over \$100 billion for Helene and Milton, with 95% of the losses uninsured. The article details the fantastic response of ROTARIANS, who gave financial and boots-on-the-ground help with recovery.

Left out of the article is why hurricanes are becoming more powerful and destructive, which scientists attribute to global warming.
