NOTES FOR ROTARIANS

Here is the procedure for selecting the National Honor Society:

- 1. A list is obtained of all students in grades 11 and 12 with a grade point average of 3.5 or higher.
- 2. These students are contacted and asked to fill out Student Activity Information form which asks students to list co-curricular activities, leadership positions. Community activities. Recognition of awards received and an essay on a topic that will be related to the National Honor Society. Students are asked to obtain two recommendations, one from a person associated with OHS such as teacher, coach, advisor and one that is not associated with OHS such as church leader, employer, or person you have volunteered service to.
- 3. The NHS advisor will give student Activity Information forms and recommendations to the faculty selection council.
- 4. The faculty selection council, consisting of eleven present staff members, is responsible for final selection. Each faculty member must make a vote of in or out for each student. The final decision of approval of each candidate for membership is by majority vote of this council.
- 5. The list of selected and non-selected students will be presented to the principal. Selected members will be inducted into the NHS during an induction ceremony.

RI BOARD AWARDS

The RI Board approved 121 members to receive the 2024-'25 Service Above Self award. They will be honored next month at the RI Convention in Calgary.
