YOUR CAR INSURANCE PREMIUM LATELY?

If you haven't received your car insurance bill, you'll probably be surprised at the premium when you do. Car insurance rates haven't risen this much since 1976. The cost of insuring a vehicle rose 19% in August compared with a year ago, contributing to an uptick in overall inflation. The bump comes after auto insurers lost an average of 12 cents for every dollar customers paid in premiums thanks in part to huge losses following Hurricane Ian's destruction in Florida. Drivers in Florida are now paying an average of \$3,183 a year for full coverage policies up 15% from 2022. Auto insurers price their plans based on the losses they are incurring in a state-by-state basis. Extreme weather has also driven up the cost of reinsurance, which gets passed on to consumers across the country.
