"For me, ROTARY service means being *ichiban*. In Japanese *ichiban* means doing your best, and being the best you can be. It means working as hard as you can, not for yourself, but for others. It means achieving as much as you can, to make other people's lives better. In the dictionary, *ichiban* means "best". But in ROTARY, "best" means something different. It means bringing Service Above Self into all of your thinking. It means looking at your own effort, not in terms of what it costs you, but in terms of what it can give. In this way, we are inspired to do so much more. It is our job to see to it that our ROTARY service is *ichiban*...so that we do the most we can to build Peace through Service."
