NOTES FOR ROTARIANS

This is fair week. Here are some facts about the Steele County Free Fair that you may not know:

- *There are over 100 volunteer superintendents that help produce the fair. Seventeen board members meet monthly year 'round to plan the fair. Their pay? One dollar per meeting...same as in 1918.
- *Remember the little steam train at the fair? It ran in the area of the current Fair Square Park in the 50's and 60's. On a quiet fair night, one could hear the steam whistle all over town.
- *Over 90 musical acts will entertain fairgoers this year.
- *The 1943 fair was cancelled because of WW II. Gas shortages meant exhibits, entertainment and the carnival couldn't get to the fair. In 1874 the fair was reduced to one day due to the influx of grasshoppers.
- *In 1906 the fair was held in downtown Owatonna and the big thrill was the "Slide of Life" which sent fairgoers from the courthouse grounds to Central Park.
- *Burke's Taffy is the longest continuous vendor at the fair. This is their 99th year at the fair.
- *Kottke Jewelers sponsored a watch drop at the fair. The watch was dropped from an airplane flying low over the fairgrounds. The event was canceled when one year the watch ended up on the roof of the beer garden and fairgoers were climbing to the roof any way they could. The beer garden was then located north of the Four Seasons about where the current auto museum is now located.
- *If you are interested in a shuttle to the fair, note that the Owatonna Bus Co. will offer free rides to the fairgrounds beginning at 11:00 a.m. Wednesday through Friday. They will load next to Central Park. Trinity Lutheran Church will also offer a shuttle to the fair beginning at 11:00 a.m. Wednesday through Friday. You can park your car in the church lot and ride to the fairgrounds.
- *Did you know? The Minnesota State Fair was held in Owatonna in 1883 and 1884. The original poster advertising the state fair is located in the Muckle Museum.
- *Butter making competition was one of the biggest attractions at the fair from 1923 until the department closed in 1969. Over 30 Steele County butter makers competed in the annual contest.
- *Airplane rides were offered to fairgoers in 1924. The planes used the racetrack as a runway.

Remember, when you are at the fair take time to stop by the fair office and purchase a membership in the Steele County Ag Society. Memberships are just \$5.00 and show your support of this great fair.

So anyway:

- *Because of COVID, for the first time since 1945 the National Spelling Bee is cancel.....cancul.....cansel....it's been called off!
