FAIR FACTS

*There are over 100 volunteer superintendents that help produce the fair. 17 board members meet monthly to organize the fair. Their pay? \$1.00 a meeting...same as in 1918.

*The Gold Star Amusements will bring 40 rides to the fair this year. This is their first year at our fair.

*Last year there were 2482 4-H exhibits at our fair. Steele Count is one of the largest 4-H counties in the state.

*Estimated attendance at the 2011 fair was 306,597...the largest ever.

*Over 860 gallons of waste grease was collected during last year's fair.

*The most popular entry in the open class last year was horses with 1242 entries. Smallest was swine with 16.

*The Minnesota State Fair dairy show was at the Steele County Free Fair in 1944-'45

*Remember the steam train at the fair? It ran in the area of the current Fair Square Park in the mid-60's.

*The Muckle Museum will feature a special section on Bob Ringhofer, who passed away recently. Bob was a member of the fair board for over 50 years.

*This year there are over 80 musical acts performing at the fair.

*The 1943 fair was cancelled because of World War II. Gas shortages meant exhibits, entertainment, and the carnival couldn't get to the fair. It is the only SCFF to be canceled. Even during the polio epidemic the fair went on as scheduled. In 1874, the Steele County Free fair was held only one day because of a grasshopper invasion. *This year's fair will feature over 312 indoor commercial booths and 226 outside stands including over 100

*This year's fair will feature over 312 indoor commercial booths and 226 outside stands including over 100 food stands.

*In 1906, the fair was held in downtown Owatonna and the big thrill was the "Slide of Life" from the courthouse to Central Park.

*One of every three visitors to the fair is not from Steele County. 25% attending the fair come 26 miles or more. 10% come over 60 miles. 76% of fairgoers come for more than one day.

*The longest continuous vendor at the SCFF is Burke's Taffy...this is their 90th year.

*Everyone goes to Tom Thumb mini-donuts. Sixty years ago, donuts were 10 cents a bag. This year Tom Thumb will have three stands at the fair.

*Kottke Jewelers sponsored a watch drop from an airplane over the fairgrounds from 1967-1970. Ted Ringhofer, former Fair Board member flew his plane and Bill Kottke dropped the watch.
