NOTES FOR ROTARIANS

This Saturday is the 46th annual Christmas Bird Count. The count has been chaired all 46 years by Darryl Hill of Owatonna. Interested in participating either in a feeder count or a field count? Contact Darryl at 451-2073.

A review of last year: The weather was terrible with winter storm warnings that advised no travel which lowered the bird count numbers. Last year, 4,025 individual birds were counted which was below the average of 4521 birds. Forty-four different species were counted which was about average. One hundred six different bird species have been seen. Last year we had 85 people counting birds with 71 of them watching at their feeders and 14 counting in the field.

There are no fees charged to participate in the bird count. The Owatonna Izaak Walton League provides financial help for local mailing expenses.

Mentors are still needed for this years STRIVE program at the high school. The commitment is one hour per month for the months of January-May. The program runs from 10:07 a.m.-11:07 a.m. Dates for the program are Jan. 11, Feb. 8th, Mar 8, April 12 and May 10. If you are interested in helping, please get ahold of ROTARIAN Michelle Krell.
