A BIT OF ROTARY HISTORY

Paul Harris traveled the world on behalf of ROTARY, but when he was home, he enjoyed life's simpler pleasures. "We had our afternoon tea before a cheery coal fire, talking leisurely of the affairs of the day." Recalled his wife Jean in the February, 1955 issue of THE ROTARIAN. "By evening, Paul was ready to visit neighbors, whom he enjoyed best just dropping in."

For nearly 40 years, Paul and Jean Harris hosted ROTARY board meetings and entertained visiting dignitaries in their home on Chicago's South Side, which they affectionately called "Comely Bank" after the street where Jean grew up in Edinburgh, Scotland. Today, the house stands in disrepair, its walls stripped to bare studs, as the group of ROTARIANS that owns it struggles to raise the money for a restoration. "Comely Bank is the Mount Vernon of ROTARY..it's the home of our founder and it's too important an asset to not do something about it," says Robert Knuepfer, 2010-11 governor of District 6450 (Illinois) and president of the Paul and Jean Harris Home Foundation.

Did you know? Dr. Ed Frederick, a frequent visitor to our club has a perfect attendance record since he joined the Waseca club in 1964. He has also served as District Governor of ROTARY District 596.

Owatonna ROTARY dollars provided a medical van in Madagascar in 1992. This was our first International Project under the chairmanship of ROTARIAN Chad Lange. \$1500 of Owatonna money was multiplied several times to make this project a success of Madagascar. The Owatonna Club also helped Waseca with their project and the next year, Waseca assisted us with a project obtaining dental equipment in Nepal.
