A note on blood pressure

Adults below age 40 who have high blood pressure are more likely to suffer from cardiovascular disease later in life, a new study has shown. Researchers recruited 4,851 Americans with an average age of 36, took their blood pressure, and tracked them over a period of 19 years. Compared with those that had normal blood pressure (120/80 or lower), those with systolic readings between 121 and 129 were 67% more likely to have issues. That figure rose to 75% for those in the overall readings in the 130/139-80/89 range and 350% for those measured above 140/90.
