"It was 109 years ago this month that Paul Harris and three of his friends founded the first ROTARY club. His goal was simple: to create an oasis of friendship amid a city of strangers, with those who shared his values. Paul Harris was fortunate in his lifetime to see the ROTARY idea take hold and establish itself in dozens of countries around the world. Every week, in 34,000 communities, his vision lives on in every ROTARY meeting. This summer, ROTARY members will gather in Sydney, Australia to reach out to the world and to one another, in an environment where all are welcome."

#### THE OBJECT OF ROTARY

The other charter members were James Adair, Mike Brown, John Campbell, J.A Dahne, Rudy Gericke, Sid Kinyon, Mike Leary, Del Mitchell, E.K. Whiting and Dr. Otto Ziegler.
