Dog ownership means better health: Dog ownership can lead to a longer, healthier life, say Swedish and U.S. researchers who studied more than 3 million dog owning Swedes ages 40-80. They found that dog owners have a lower risk of death due to cardiovascular disease during a 12-year follow-up period than people who don't own dogs. Among people who live alone, dog owners fared particularly well, with a 33 percent reduction in risk of death and 11 percent decreased risk of myocardial infarction compared to non-owners. Increased physical activity and social contact may partly explain the results, scientists said.
