Various bragger buck announcements and introductions at our club meetings have sometimes become far too lengthy for the time we have available. In respect to our speakers on the program, we ask that you keep these announcements to a minute or less in length.

This year we will experience an influx of candidates for the upcoming special elections as well as the November elections. Your program chair along with Brad Meier of the Chamber of Commerce and Jeffrey Jackson of the Peoples Press have met to schedule Meet the Candidate sessions. The first of these will be on March 30 when the primary election candidates for the county election will be on hand. All of October's meetings will be candidate sessions for local city, county and school board elections. Note that when we have Meet the Candidate sessions, lunch will begin at 11:30 a.m.

Who knows what ROTARY does? An average of 62 percent of non-ROTARIANS on an international level recognize the ROTARY name, but of those, only 37 percent have some familiarity with what ROTARY does, according to the results of a 2010 public image survey. RI commissioned the survey of about 1,000 people in each of six countries...Argentina, Australia, Germany, Japan, South Africa and the United States...to gauge the general public's awareness and perception of the organization. The results are consistent with those of a similar survey conducted in 2006: While respondents had heard of ROTARY, they knew little about its activities.

When respondents were asked how they would describe ROTARIANS, about 65% answered "charitable", "respected", and "caring". But only 26% described ROTARIANS as women, and 50% described them as men, indicating that ROTARY needs to do more to highlight its female membership. Overall, the public's interest in joining ROTARY is low. Here in the United States, women were half as likely as men to report an interest in joining. The report concluded that public image efforts will need to be customized for each country and that boosting awareness alone will not be enough to associate ROTARY with good works, or to generate greater community involvement.
