In addition to tuition and supplies for a year of schooling, each girl and her family received a sheep as part of a ROTARY FOUNDATION GLOBAL GRANT PROJECT sponsored by the ROTARY Clubs of Concord, Calif., and Ouagadougou, with support from local non profits. The grant also provided a well to reduce the time the young girls must spend fetching water for their families which often keeps them out of school.
