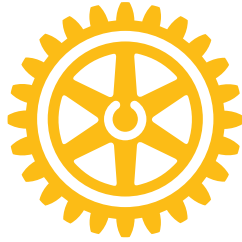

Districts 4855/5960 have arranged for an outbound April 30-May 10, 2014, ROTARY FRIENDSHIP EXCHANGE to Buenos Aires Province in Argentina. Application and deposit is due by February 10. The application can be assessed on-line through the RI District 5960 website, click on "programs" at the top of the page and on Buenos Aires under RFE on the left side of the screen.

Meanwhile, applicants are now being accepted for the new Global Grant Scholarship from our District. Worth \$30,000 annually, this exclusive scholarship will help fund a graduate-level student from the district to pursue educational and service dreams generating impact in the areas of ROTARY's new future focus:

*Peace and conflict prevention/resolution

*Disease prevention and treatment

*Water and sanitation

*Maternal and child health

*Basic education and literacy

*Economic and community development

Global grant scholarship applications are now available at the district website. Qualified candidates must submit completed application for review and support by their local ROTARY club by March 14, 2014. Interviews for district finalists will be conducted on May 3, 2014 in the Twin Cities. Scholarship recipient will then be able to study at an international university starting fall, 2015.
