Who knows what ROTARY does? An average of 62 percent of non-ROTARIANS recognize the ROTARY name, but of those, only 37 percent have some familiarity with what ROTARY does, according to the results of a 2010 public image survey. RI commissioned the survey of about 1,000 people in each of six countries: Argentina, Australia, Germany, Japan, South Africa and the United States to guage the general public's awareness and perception of the organization. The results are consistent with those of a similar survey conducted in 2006. While respondents had heard of ROTARY, they knew little about its activities.

Ordering out for pizza might not seem like a big deal. But consider 33 children waiting for polio vaccine. Just think: For the same price, you can help these children live free of polio through the ROTARY FOUNDATION. And, to you, it's no big deal. It's a *better* deal.
