ROTARY NOTES

Your Board of Directors recently approved a contribution of \$1,000 to partner with the Faribault ROTARY Club in their project to build a Cassava Processing Plant in Sierra Leone, West Africa. This project for economic and community development will directly benefit 2000 farmers and 5000 residents in Matoko and several surrounding villages in the Manjay section of the Makarie Gbantie Chiefdom near Makeni, Sierra Leone. The beneficiaries are among the poorest people in Sierra Leone, on of the poorest countries in Africa, the world's poorest continent. Through this project, cassava fields will be doubled in acreage, from 70 to 140 acres. Within four years the land under cultivation should be 900 acres. The processing plant will enable local farmers to wash, cut, prepare, package, store and sell cassava, a tuber used for a variety of uses. The project will be sustainable, with growth projected for many years ahead.

Last week, President John related that we have an opportunity to host a fourth In-Bound student from India at little cost to our club. In an austerity move, the Faribault Public School Board has elected to de-fund all of their exchange programs. Faribault has sponsored two inbound students for the next school year. One of their inbound students has been "adopted" by the Northfield Club and their school district has agreed to enroll him. That leaves the young man from India without a school. Faribault ROTARY will pay all the expenses and fees for him if we can find host families for him here in Owatonna. From the board members who have responded, all have approved the plan and we will need to find enough host families to sponsor all of our in-bound students next year including from Italy, Russia, Thailand and this additional student from India. INFORMATION JUST FOR ROTARIANS: Sleep is important. A good night's sleep may help keep the memory sharp in older adults, according to a study from the University of California, Berkeley. The report ties age-related atrophy in parts of the brain to reduced quality of sleep, which in turn hinders the ability to store new memories. The researchers presented retirement-age adults and those in their early 20's with new information and tested them on it before bedtime and again in the morning. On average, the seniors got less sleep, of lower quality; the researchers found that this may play a role in age-related cognitive decline.
