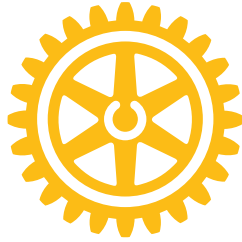

A message from incoming RI President John F. Germ:

“It is tremendously important to ROTARY’s future that our role in the eradication of polio be recognized. The more we are known for what we’ve achieved, the more we’ll be able to attract the partners, the funding, and most important, the members to achieve even more. We’re working hard to be sure that ROTARY gets that recognition. We need you to get the word out through your clubs and in your communities about what ROTARY is and what we do. We need to be sure that our clubs are ready for the moment when polio is finally eradicated...so that when people who want to do good see that ROTARY is a place where they can change the world. Ice your hand...ease a toothache: Rub an ice cube on the webbed spot between your thumb and index finger.
