When Joe Otin, a member of the ROTARY Club of Nairobi East, Kenya, was in India last January he visited the country's largest mosque and saw this boy at the taps used for washing feet. "He took the opportunity of filling two plastic bottles with water and then had a few sips," Otin recalls. "This reminded me of the lack of access to clean water for millions of families." Otin notes that district governors in Africa have agreed to work on projects addressing water and sanitation, one of ROTARY'S six areas of focus.
