Do you know the location of the world's largest library? It is the U.S. Library of Congress, established in 1800. Laid end-to-end, its shelves would stretch from Switzerland to Northern Ireland. Among the more than 155 million items in its collection is one of the world's smallest books: "Old King Cole", which is smaller than a grain of rice.

You'll find more than books at Chicago's Field Museum. Objects available for loan include a replica of a Tyrannosaurus Rex skull and a box of shoes from around the world. At libraries in Pima County, Ariz., residents can check out packets of seeds, with more than 433 types to choose from.
