NOTES FOR ROTARIANS

The Owatonna Commercial Historic District, roughly bounded by North Cedar, West and East Broadway, West Bridge and West Main was recently listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The district was listed in the National Register as a distinct example of a downtown business district that served as the commercial center of the county and region. The historic district consists of 12 city blocks, including Central Park which is the focal point of the district. The park is fronted by three properties listed in the National Register of Historic Places including the National Farmers' Bank on the north, the Steele County courthouse on the southeast and the City and Firemen's Hall on the south. The district consists of 91 properties, including 75 contributing buildings, one contributing park, 13 non-contributing buildings and two non-contributing sites. The contributing buildings range in date from 1876 to the late 1950's and reflect three significant building periods: the last quarter of the 19th century; the first three decades of the 20th century and the period from 1930 to the late 1950's.
