ROTARY NOTES

*The Board of Directors has voted to support the "Imagination Library", launched by country music star Dolly Parton and the Dollywood Foundation. The board approved allocating the total cost of the first year which amounts to \$6,500. Through this program, every child in Steele County, regardless of language, cultural or economic differences will develop a healthy love of reading, have a proficient vocabulary, and begin school with the early literacy skills that are important for academic success.

*In a multi-community study of the program, three important conclusions emerged: Between 66% and 75% of families reported that they read more frequently to their children after receiving the Imagination Library; the lower the family's income the greater the impact on frequency. For 34% of the families, the Imagination Library was the primary source of books in the home.

*All Steele County children will enter school with shared experiences by having read the same books as their peers. This will ease the transition to school and allow teachers to leverage these shared experiences.

*Over time, as more children graduate from the Steele County Imagination Library program, the school and workplace achievement gap will be dramatically reduced.

<u>The Role of ROTARY:</u> The Owatonna ROTARY Club will make an annual club contribution to support the costs of the program. During National Literacy Month (March), ROTARIANS will be given a chance to make an individual contribution to sponsor a child.

<u>COSTS</u>: Cost of books is \$25.00 per year per Steele County child which includes 12 books plus monthly shipping directly to the child's address. The first year, the number of children is estimated at 261 reflecting a total cost of \$6,525 which the board has authorized the club to pay toward the start-up of the program. The board will address the amount of yearly contribution each year.

The Board of Directors felt that this is an excellent program that directly benefits Steele County children and enthusiastically endorsed our club's involvement. ROTARIAN Tanya Paley is coordinating the program.
