He played in the Brass Renegades, Klecker Band, the Local 490 Band and the Elks Concert Band.

<u>Dr. Trent Jacobs:</u> OHS Class of 1999. He has served on the music faculty at the U. of Wisconson, Eau Claire as the bassoon instructor and lecturer of music theory and aural skills since 2015. He designed and manufactures the "Little Jake" pickup that amplifies the bassoon. He is a prolific reed maker operating as the band Weasel Reeds for bassoon and contrabassoon.

<u>Gloria Coulter:</u> Has taught music to Owatonna elementary students for nearly 25 years. She plays for many music events in Owatonna. She has sung in several chorales including the Roger Tenney Chorale.
