So anyway: The four Goldberg brothers, Lowell, Norman, Hiram and Maxwell, invented and developed the first automobile air conditioner. On a hot July day, 1946, the temperature was 97 degrees in Detroit. The 4 brothers walked into old man Henry Ford's office and sweet-talked his secretary into telling him that 4 gentlemen were there with the most exciting innovation in the auto industry since the electric starter. Henry was curious and invited them into his office. They refused and instead asked that he come out to the parking lot to their car. They persuaded him to get into the car, which was about 130 degrees, turned on the air conditioner and cooled the car off immediately. The old man got very excited and offered them \$3 million for the patent. The brothers refused, saying they would settle for \$2 million, but they wanted the recognition by having a label "The Goldberg Air Conditioner" on the dashboard of each car in which it was installed. Now, old man Ford was more than just a little anti-Semitic, and there was no way he was going to put the Goldberg's name on two million Fords. They haggled back and forth for about two hours and finally agreed on \$4 million and that just their first names would be show. And so, to this day, all Ford air conditioners show –Lo, Norm, Hi and Max on the controls.
