Applications must be received by 4:00 p.m. CST this Friday, October 15 to be considered. It is the intent of the District to assemble a Task Force of 20-30 members to represent a broad cross-section of the community, and those who served on the 2019 Task Force are welcome to apply. The Task Forcer will meet approximately six times November through January. Applicants must be residents of the District, and attendance at all meetings is critical. Those selected for the Task Force will be notified by October 25.
