The purpose of this award is to recognize a non-ROTARIAN whose life and actions exemplify the spirit of the ROTARY motto, "Service Above Self" and exhibits the characteristics which represent the values of ROTARY'S 4-Way Test.

Mr. Burmeister is the board president of the Owatonna Arts Center and was instrumental in the recent addition to the OAC. He was one of the key people involved in the development of the Recovery School whose purpose is to nurture children with addiction issues, providing them a safe place to learn without the distraction of everyday high school life. He brought Chapter 710 of SCORE to Owatonna, which helps people to start new businesses or move fledgling businesses forward. He is a key fundraiser at his church, helps out at the local food shelf every Monday, and is a board member of his homeowner association.
