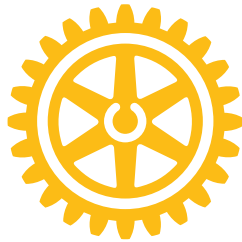

### **ROTARY NOTES**

District Governor Kyle Haugen lives in Prairie Lake, Minnesota. He is an agent for Haugen Agency Inc. His education includes graduation from Prairie Lake Senior High in 1996 and Hamline University in 2000. Today you will no doubt hear his thoughts on the ROTARY PolioPlus program.

On October 24, ROTARY will mark WORLD POLIO DAY. It is a day to celebrate how far we have come and an opportunity for all of us to raise awareness and funds to complete the work of eradication.

In the years since PolioPlus was launched, the combine efforts of ROTARY, THE GOVERNMENTS OF THE WORLD, AND THE Global Polio Eradication Initiative have brought the number of cases of polio down from an estimated 350,000 per year to just a few so far in 2017. But we must reach zero cases and stay there, to achieve eradication. To do that, everyone's help is needed.
