<u>A MESSAGE FROM RI PRESIDENT KALYAN BANERJEE</u>: "We have a color for the 2011-12 ROTARY year and that color is green. Why green? Because green is the color of new life, of bright leaves bursting forth from spreading branches. And there is no doubt that it is time to "green" ROTARY.

Overall in ROTARY, only 11 percent of our members are under the age of 40 while 68 percent are over 50 and 39 percent are over 60. We need to bring in younger members, who will breathe new life and new vigor into our organization.
