The Moncton West Rotary Charities Inc. was incorporated in mid-2021 to comply with CRA rules governing the separation of duties between the club and a separate charities board. The first meeting of the charities board was held August 16, 2021.

The Moncton West Rotary Charities Inc., board of directors in the 2022-2023 year reviewed and updated the charities governance documents and updated the charities application review process. Furthermore, from July 1, 2022, until June 30, 2023, the board has been active, reviewing grant applications in accordance with criteria and an evaluation process developed by the board. The Charities Board in the 2022-2023 year has granted \$118,640 in funds raised by the Rotary Club. Funds were granted to the following organizations:
