





# "Breakfast with Santa" **2015**

Sun City Rotary Club, Georgetown Fire Department, Georgetown Independent School District and the Assistance League-Georgetown Area (a NEW BWS PARTNER) are very pleased to recognize and extend a huge "THANK YOU" to all the 2015 "Breakfast with Santa" sponsors, donors and volunteers who again made this community-wide project possible. Your help made Christmas a lot brighter for 177 children (55 Georgetown families), 30 teenagers served by "The NEST" (The Georgetown Project program) plus families helped by Jarrell's UMC Christmas out-reach program (BWS bought 18 bicycles for Jarrell kids).

We especially thank our *Pacesetting Sponsor* - the Albert and Ethel Herzstein Charitable Foundation located in Houston, whose generous \$6,000 sponsorship enabled us to again increase the number of kids helped this year. All children received coats and clothing (funded this year by <u>a NEW BWS PARTNER</u>: **Assistance League-Georgetown Area**) as well as toys. Every family received an H-E-B grocery gift card ranging from \$150 to \$325 and teenagers received envelopes with gift cards for food, movies and clothing.

2015 was Sun City Rotary Club's 15<sup>th</sup> "Breakfast with Santa" (much, much more than "breakfast") which has gradually increased from a total of ten children (3 Georgetown families) to the current level. Rotarians managed fundraising efforts and delivered donations to either the Chisholm Trail Communities Foundation or directly to the Rotary Club. GISD Counselors identified this year's families and provided clothing sizes and information for the selected children (coordination provided by Jan Williams –YMCA of Greater Williamson County). Rotarians, spouses, friends and other volunteers bought, wrapped and distributed over 1000 purchased items. "Breakfast with Santa" concluded with a pancake and sausage breakfast at the San Gabriel Community Center on Saturday, December 12. Georgetown Firefighters, Rotarians and volunteers cooked the meal and served over 1000 children and adults. Santa also made an early visit to Georgetown that morning and was available for consultation and complimentary photos with the kids.

"THANK YOU," once again, to everyone who supported "Breakfast with Santa" in 2015.
