

been selected and gifts will be provided to 161 children in 53 families.


\Jan Williams, Director of Extended School Enrichment from Georgetown Independent School District, has been involved in the program since its inception in 2001. Jan loves "seeing the smiles on the children's faces and the tears of joy and gratitude from the parents." She gets the project rolling by searching for those in need. Counselors in the district schools aid the process by

providing information. Once the kids and their families are identified, the parents get involved by providing specific needs and wants, as well as, clothing sizes all the way down to shoe sizes for each child. Then personal shoppers (Rotarians and other helpers) take over and pick out individual gifts. These bargain hunters know how to stretch a dollar while still providing exactly what's needed for each youngster. The final result is over 800 gifts purchased, grocery cards for each family as well as food and movie gift cards for teenagers.

Next comes the wrapping. As Rotarians, spouses and volunteers meet the week before the breakfast, they use a system that keeps family gifts together. The workers spend hours carefully wrapping and labeling each present. This year's selected families will pick up their gifts either before or after enjoying breakfast and talking with Santa.


